STANDING ORDER No. 6/74.

As laid in Rule 33(2) of the Rajasthan Police Subordinate Service Rules, 1966 the following instructions are issued regarding practical training for directly recruited Sub-Inspectors of Armed Police and Platoon Commanders of R.A.C. who are appointed on probation.

2. On completion of initial training at Police Training Institute for 9 months, the probationer shall be put through the following course of practical training for a period of 4 months:-

1. To work as Section Commander	1 week	SI AP/PC
2. To work as staff duties like C.H.M./ C.Q.M.H.	1 week	SI QM/PC QM
3. To under study P.C.	2 week	SI/AP/P-C Adjt.
4. To work as BN H M and BN.QM.H.	1 week	RI/Sub.Dj +Adjt.
5. To work as Sub Adjutants and Sub-Quartermaster.	1 week	Dy.S.P. Adjt.
6. Attached with Range Hqrs. Police Lines to learn duties of SI AP.	2 weeks	
7. Attached with P.T.C. for law & final examination of probationer as per standing order No.2/72 Final tests in P.T.C.	8 week	Principal,

3. After the completion of the above practical training, the Supdt. of Police/Commandant shall judge the performance of the probationer and decide in the light of the training received by him if he is fit for confirmation. In case it is decided to confirm him the probationer shall be posted as SI AP/ PC independently.

4. The question of extending the period of probation or of confirmation should be decided invariably before the expiry of the specific period of probation.

5. It should be ensured that the candidates receive thorough and systematic theoretical training while at the School in nearly all branches of Police work and the object to be borne in mind during the course of practical training is that they should be taught how to apply in a practical way the theory they have learnt in the School.

6. Throughout their practical training, probationer Sub Inspectors should invariably be addressed, and should style themselves in official correspondence as " Probationery Sub- Inspectors."
