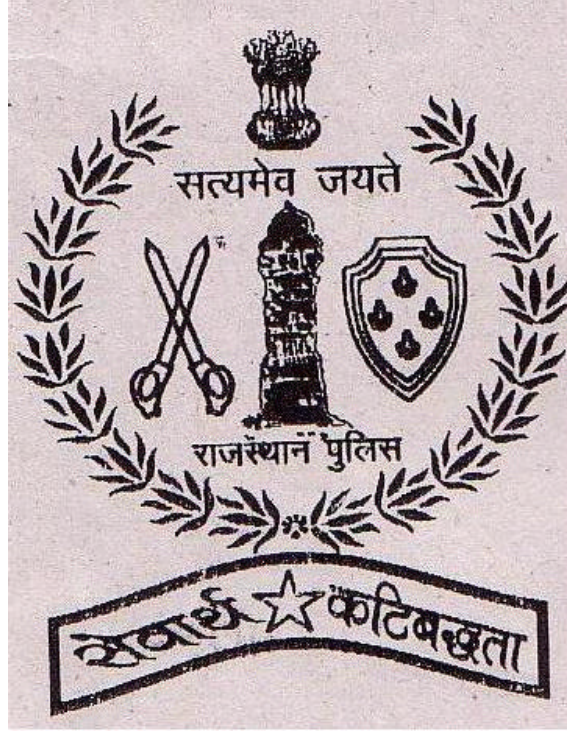

Advanced Professional Skill Enhancement Course at R.P.A. (Phase-II)

All trainees after completion of the practical training in respective districts for 30½ weeks at various Police Stations and Circle offices shall undergo to advanced professional skill enhancement course for sixteen weeks at R.P.A. They will be given intensive training on certain subjects pertaining to Police Practical works. The training during phase-II at R.P.A. will be imparted as under -

1. Supervisory of Circle officers & control of crime 1½ weeks
2. Investigation of body offences 2 weeks

3.	Investigation of property offences	3 weeks
4.	Investigation of economic offences & cyber crime	2 weeks
5.	General exceptions	½ week
6.	Investigation of special/minor/social offences	2 weeks
7.	DNA/finger prints/foot prints	½ week
8.	Investigation of crime against women	1 week
9.	Communication skill & report writing	1 week
10.	Brain mapping & Narco analysis	½ week
11.	Law and order management	2 weeks

Training on above mentioned subjects would also include visits to Courts, Jail and F.S.L. etc. After such visits a debriefing session will be organized any each probationer will be asked to give his brief impression on learning in writing and verbal as well. The visits to places will cover the following steps/points :-

- a. Inspection of scene of occurrence & collection of physical clues, packing, labeling & forwarding of exhibits to F.S.L. for examination. It will also include preparation of site-plan, examination of witnesses and recording of statements u/s 161 Cr.P.C., search and seizures, conducting identification parade of property and suspects, writing case diaries, framing of charge sheet and putting up challans in the concerned court, linking of circumstantial, physical oral and other important piece of evidence for proving the case.
- b. Practical handling of Anti-sabotage checking equipment, identification of explosives, use of mobile cameras, tape-recorders, hearing-bugs, ultra-sensitive microphones, fax interceptors, e-mail interceptors, mobile phone interceptors and relevant law on the subjects.
- c. Practical tips about handling disaster management, riots and violent agitation and hostage situation.
- d. Brain mapping includes introduction, benefits, procedure and system.
- e. Narco analysis includes procedure, clarity in system and applicable laws.
- f. Economic offences & cyber crime will include knowledge of interception of cell phones, pornographic calls, its decoding, tracing out the originator etc.
- g. Special/Minor/Social offences includes details knowledge about NDPS Act, Arms & Explosive Acts, atrocities against weaker sections etc.

- h. During study of property offences, emphasis should be made on "Recovery of stolen Property in Original Form", its legality, methods and linking evidence referring to old records, MOB, SCRB, NCRB, preparing cases u/s 401 & 402 of IPC i.e. gang cases and experts on the subjects.

The Scheme of Examination :

During the institutional training at R.P.A. There will be a mid-session examination both in Indoor and Outdoor subjects. Such examination will be held on completion of four months of training. Questions will be asked from the subjects matter taught by that time in both Outdoor and Indoor subjects.

The mid-session examination will be conducted by a board appointed by the Director, R.P.A. in both Indoor and Outdoor subjects. 20% marks of the total marks in each paper, barring qualifying subjects, will be allotted for the mid-session examination. Remaining 80% marks will be allotted for examination by the board.

Board Examination :

A board comprising of one IGP as Chairman, two Dy.IGP as member and Dy. Director, R.P.A. as member Secretary, appointed by the D.G.P., Rajasthan will conduct the final examinations before concluding of training at R.P.A. for Indoor paper I to XI and Outdoor subjects I to VII.

As indicated above the board will award in aforesaid papers out of 80% of the total marks of an individual paper. But while compiling the results, the score from the rest 20% marks will also be added based on the probationer's performance in mid-session examination.

Local Examination :

The local examination in the following subjects of Indoor & Outdoor will be conducted at R.P.A. by a board headed by the Director, R.P.A. Here also the above principle of 20% /80% marks will held good for mid-session/final examination except in case qualifying subjects in which the trainees will have to pass in the final examination independently of score in mid-session examination.
