

STANDING ORDER NO. 1 1972.

13-6-1972

Sub :- DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION OF DIRECT RECRUITED
PROBATIONER SUB INSPECTORS OF POLICE (I.B.)
ON COMPLETION OF PRACTICAL TRAINING.

In the light of the Rajasthan Police Sub-ordinate Service Rules, 1966 and the Rajasthan Civil Service (Departmental Examination) Rules, 1958, it has been decided to introduce a departmental examination of Probationary Sub-Inspectors of Police (IB), appointed as a result of combined competitive examination by direct recruitment through open market, on completion of their practical training. The Probationary S.Is. 9 (IB) are eligible for confirmation only after they pass this departmental examination. The syllabus and courses of the said departmental examination for Sub-Inspectors of Police (IB) is appended herewith.

2. The Board consisting of a D.I.G., GID (IB) Rajasthan, Jaipur (As Chairman), Asstt. I.G. of Police (I) and S.P. GID (SB) as nominated by the I.G. of Police, Rajasthan will conduct the departmental examination and declare result after getting it approved from the I.G. of Police. The examination will be held at Jaipur or any other place as may be decided by the Chairman after getting approval of I.G.P.

3. The Probationer who fails to get pass marks only in one paper in the examination may take this examination again in that paper only at the subsequent examination held. The Probationer who fails to get pass marks in more than one paper shall take the examination a new.


4. T.A. & D.A. for journey to the place of examination will be allowed for the first and second attempts only.

5. In case of the Probationer fails to get through the examination even in three attempts, he will be considered by the I.G. of Police for removal from service on grounds of unfitness.

6. The Probationer absenting himself from the examination without permission from the I.G.P. will be considered to have failed at the examination for the purposes of confirmation.

7. The Probationer who either at the time of examination or subsequently is found using unfair means or practices for passing or attempting to pass the examination, will be considered by the Board and the reports sent to the Inspector-General of Police for such action as he may deem fit.

III PAPER (OUTDOOR)

Viva Voce on Practical SB methods, Work Diaries and Assessment of theses on Organisation of Political Parties in Rajasthan.

In this paper, the practical performance of the candidates will be judged from the daily work diaries and thesis on organisation of political parties allotted to each trainee.

During the Course of practical training the daily work diaries of each trainee will be scrutinized by the S.P. concerned or Addl.S.P./S.P. of Zones, concerned. These work diaries would be forwarded by the Ss.P. and Zone Officers to the S.P. CID SSB for purpose of assessment for confirmation tests,

while forwarding the work diaries of trainees the concerned Ss.P. or Zone Officers will give their comments on their working.

The trainees will be interviewed at the time of confirmation test and the thesis written by each ~~train~~ trainee will be assessed.

This paper will be allotted 100 marks out of which 25 marks will be for Viva Voce on Practical SB matters, 25 marks of assessment of work diaries maintained by the trainees during practical training and the remaining 50 marks will for assessment of the thesis written by the trainee on organisation of Political Parties in Rajasthan.
