C I R C U L A R No. 40 L

It is observed by the I.G.P. that Police Officers generally proceed to check big feasts held in their jurisdiction without adequate police force at their command with the result that serious clash between the people participating in the feasts and the police take place. Recently one such clash occurred at village Mehdi Sub-Dn. Bundi. The S.I. along with only five police men reached the aforesaid village to check a feast held to observe mausar ceremony in which more than ten thousand persons participated. The unfortunate result was that the police party including the Sub-Inspector received serious injuries in the clash. // A

It is, therefore, enjoined upon all the police officers that they should not attempt to enforce law without adequate force at their disposal. This is with a view to ensure that such serious incidents are not repeated in future. Supdts. of Police are requested to draw attention of all the Circle Officers, Circle Inspectors, Station House Officers and other ranks to the notifications and orders that are issued by the Government of the Supply Department from time to time in this connection. The S.I. should particularly draw the attention of all the officers concerned to the Civil Supplies Department's Notification No.F.14(4)CS/51 dated 14-4-54 published in the Rajasthan Gazette in Part I(B) Volume 6 No.8 dated 24.4.54 at pages 47 and 48 under which restrictions on feasting in rural areas have been removed.
